This year, every special day, every event, every new project, is dedicated to and is a celebration of the 77th Anniversary of the opening of Birchy Hill as a care facility in the community of Sway and surrounding areas.




I would like to start this newsletter by telling you about its history, and a few famous residents who have lived here during these years, I'm sure there were many others.

Birchy Hill was originally built in the mid-1880's for 3 spinster sisters, the Misses Barnards. During World War II, the building was requisitioned for use by the Army, and after the war the property was vacated, and made available for sale.

Richard and Doris Howells purchased Birchy Hill in 1947, and opened a Nursing Home caring for physically and mentally ill patients. Richard Howell was a State Registered Nurse and Registered Mental Nurse, and had served in the 5th Field Ambulance during the war.

One of Birchy Hill's famous residents was Charlotte "Lottie" Dod, who settled at Birchy Hill Nursing Home when she moved to the South Coast in 1954. She played tennis, and was a Wimbledon winner in 1887, 1888, 1891, 1892, and 1893. She passed away at the age of 88 while listening to the Wimbledon radio broadcast in bed.

On 8 October 1961 when the island's volcano erupted, he helped all 263 islanders, and 26 expatriates escape to the safety of Nightingale Island – 25 miles away.

D-Day Week started with decorating indoors and outdoors. They were selected, and co-ordinated, as usual, by our Manager Mark, and put in place by a great team of people.








Our residents created D-Day collages while reminiscing, and singing war time songs.


Also welcome to new personnel who have recently joined us in different areas: Merry (Registered Nurse), Emma (activities), Elaine (domestic), and Cherry (care).
